

New Initiatives

Integrating sustainability and environmental justice into the curriculum has long been a goal of the Sustainability Committee and Office of Sustainability. Interdisciplinary classes, such as JCL 130, EES 120 and POL 126, have creatively interwoven topics of environmental justice, food and climate into coursework coupled with meaningful and relevant community engagement. Academic working groups tasked with furthering sustainability curriculum have organized research and teaching symposia, speaker series, movie screenings and much more throughout the years.

A current project underway with the aim of expanding sustainability-related curricular and co-curricular offerings is to develop recommendations and plans to utilize our resource-rich 420 acre campus for equitable and sustainable solutions. The campus as a living laboratory model provides opportunities for the Saint Mary's community to advance sustainability through place-based research, internships and teaching. Harnessing our campus' natural and built environment for curricular and co-curricular projects encourages the application of knowledge to a real-world context, enhances connections and skill development, and provides more opportunities to reach our climate goals.

A natural fit to test and develop this living lab model is in Saint Mary's half-acre campus garden. The outdoor educational space and working landscape aims to foster community while enhancing learning, promoting physical and emotional health and encouraging just, sustainable agrifood systems.

As the Legacy Garden enters its next phase we welcome all Saint Mary's staff, faculty and students to co-envision how this important resource could be enhanced and expanded for teaching, research, community and cultural events and to advance sustainable systems. To gather input, ideas, feedback and recommendations, we hosted a series of participatory garden visioning sessions.



THE LEGACY GARDEN

Saint Mary's half-acre campus garden is a living laboratory home to a diverse range of organic fruits, vegetables, flowers, herbs, fruit trees and animals. The outdoor educational space aims to foster community, enhance academic learning, promote physical and emotional health, and encourage just and sustainable agrifood systems.



As the Legacy Garden enters its next phase, we invite all members of the Saint Mary's community to co-generate ideas, visions and programs for this important campus resource. We hope these visioning sessions will allow students, staff and faculty to collaboratively reimagine or reaffirm the purpose and benefits of the campus garden, as well as identify infrastructure needs and new possibilities.



Expanding Community Engagement Opportunities for Students

This year, dozens of community engagement students based at the Legacy Garden got out of our campus bubble to participate in one of five off-campus engagement opportunities at three urban farms engaging in on-the-ground transformative agrifood system change: Alameda Point Collaborative's (APC) Farm2Market, John Muir Land Trust Family Harvest Farm, and Healthy Hearts Institute.

We look forward to expanding these partnerships as well as offer these off-campus opportunities to the broader Saint Mary's community in the future.

ABOUT THE INTERNSHIP

Collaboration between CILSA's Community Based Internship program and the Office of Sustainability.

The intern works in the Legacy Garden 4 hours per week and works closely with the Sustainability Director to provide strategic leadership with the goal of expanding off-campus food justice engagement opportunities.

Alameda Point Collaborative (APC) Farm2Market



APC is a transformed naval base, housing over 500 formerly unhoused residents.

The **Farm2Market** program provides a CSA and employment opportunities to APC residents.

During our three community engagement days we:

- Toured the farm
- Fertigated (irrigated + fertilized)
- Weeded & prepped a bed
- Harvested winter squash
- Fed & pet the pig!

John Muir Land Trust Family Harvest Farm Pittsburg, CA

The Farm employs **transition-age foster youth** in a hands-on job-readiness program. The farm manager works closely with the foster youth and full-time, onsite social worker - a SMC alum!

During our community engagement day we:

- Toured the farm
- Mulched
- Weeded & prepped a bed





Healthy Hearts Institute El Pueblo - Pittsburg, CA

Founded by Ray Harts, who grew up in El Pueblo neighborhood in Pittsburg. Ray has returned to El Pueblo to farm a 2 acre parcel with the vision of providing fresh produce with a pay-what-you-can market stand, employment opportunities and educational workshops for the community.

During our community engagement day we:

• Planted over 300 native plants for the farm's new hedgerow!







Lasallian Values, Global Connections: Saint Mary's Leads Conversation on Sustainability

When it comes to having global conversations about sustainability, Saint Mary's College is quite literally leading the way for Lasallian educational institutions. As part of its 2023 Lasallian Heritage Days, in conjunction with Earth Month, the College's Office of Sustainability and Office of Mission collaborated with the International Association of LaSalle Universities (IALU) to hold a global dialogue on sustainability. The virtual event was attended by Lasallian educators from around the world—from Burkina Faso to Brussels, Rome to Mexico, the Philippines to Pennsylvania and far beyond—spanning time zones and areas of focus within the broad field of sustainability. As Vice President of Mission Francis Sweeney noted, the gathering sent a powerful message about the connection between two core Lasallian values: "care for the earth and the power of education to transform lives and communities."

In Saint Mary's strategic plan, Sweeney noted during the event, "We have expectations for global involvement and sustainability. So today, we really wanted to highlight the great work by our Lasallian partners and dream together about advancing sustainability."
